On Wednesday 10 September the Academic Quality Agency for New Zealand Universities hosted its second Support for Quality Conference. The conference, with a theme of "Challenges and Innovations in Internal Quality Assurance", was held in Wellington at the Royal Society of New Zealand. Approximately 50 attendees from across New Zealand and the Pacific met to share and discuss common challenges and recent innovations in areas such as self-assessment, student engagement, graduate outcomes, and programme approval and review.

# Cycle 5 Academic Audits

Two academic audits have been undertaken since the last AQA newsletter. It is anticipated that the report of the academic audit of the University of Auckland will be available from the AQA website in late-October 2014. The Auckland Audit Panel was chaired by Emeritus Professor Gareth Jones (University of Otago). Professor Jones was joined by Emeritus Professor Roger Field, Professor Cindy Kiro, Mr Graeme McNally, Professor Jeremy Bradshaw (Scotland) and Professor Hilary Winchester (Australia).

The report of the academic audit of Victoria University of Wellington will be available from the AQA website before the end of the year. The Victoria Audit Panel was chaired by Professor Robert Hannah (University of Waikato). Professor Hannah was joined by Associate Professor Lindsey Conner, Professor Marion Jones, Professor Hirini Matunga, and Emeritus Professor Mairéad Browne (Australia).

The audit of the University of Canterbury is underway and the site visit for this audit will commence on 24 November 2014. The University of Waikato and AUT University will both be audited in the second half of 2015. www.aqa.ac.nz/cycle5

### The Board's Role in Audit

The Board of AQA has, among its terms of reference, responsibility for appointing audit panels and for receiving and approving the release of audit reports. The Board must ensure that the process of audit is such to produce reports that reflect an independent judgement, are evidence-based and that are perceived as authoritative, rigorous, fair and perceptive. The Board receives and reviews the formal follow-up report from each audited New Zealand university approximately 12 months after the public release of the audit report.

# Pacific Colleagues meet in Wellington

A number of colleagues in quality assurance from around the Pacific met in Wellington on Tuesday 9 September to share experiences, practices and challenges, and to discuss opportunities for cooperation and collaboration. The idea of the informal forum arose from discussions at the most recent Asia-Pacific Quality Network (APQN) meeting and AQA was delighted to be able to host this event in the afternoon prior to the 2014 AQA

Attendees came from six countries: Fiji, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Tonga, Vanuatu, and New Zealand. Following country updates and a presentation from Dr Sereana Kubuabola (University of the South Pacific) on institutional research, the discussion focused on the need for training in quality audit/

reviewers, how best to continue to share experiences and practices (e.g. via email, physical meetings and/or Skype), the question of mutual recognition, and how to increase the profile and recognition of the Pacific in APQN. Feedback indicates attendees found it to be a worthwhile meeting, and there are plans to keep the dialogue going. AQA thanks Lafi Sanerivi (SPBEA) for helping to coordinate the agenda.

## Enhancement & Innovation in HE

The second international conference on Enhancement and Innovation in Higher Education will be held from 9-11 June 2015 in Glasgow, Scotland. This three-day event will explore a range of student transitions and other aspects of quality enhancement, including:

- Approaches to transitions
- Empowering students through transitions
- Transitions:
  - o into higher education
  - o relating to placements/work experience
  - o into employment
  - o to research and further study
  - o relating to specific disciplines
- International aspects of transitions
- Quality enhancement: national approaches
- Enhancement descriptors/evidencing impact.

Enhancement Themes are part of the Scottish Quality Enhancement Framework (QEF) which has been designed "to support higher education institutions in managing the quality of the student learning experience and to provide public confidence in the quality and standards of higher education".
